ACTA Press is committed to the long-term preservation, usability, authenticity, and accessibility of all published material.

1. Scope of Preservation

The following materials are preserved:

- Published articles (PDF and source formats)
- Supplementary materials (datasets, figures, appendices)
- Metadata (DOIs, author details, affiliations, abstracts)

2. Preservation Partner

Digital content is archived through a formal agreement with the National Library of Canada, with the following technical measures in place:

- Digital files are stored in archival-quality formats (e.g., PDF).
- Content is mirrored across redundant, geographically distributed servers.
- Regular integrity checks and metadata validation ensure file authenticity.

3. Risk Mitigation

Our preservation system is designed to guard against:

- Hardware or software failure
- File format obsolescence
- Unauthorized tampering or loss of metadata
- Environmental and operational hazards

4. Policy Review

This preservation strategy is a *breathing document* which is reviewed monthly to remain compliant with industry standards and to adapt to contemporary advancements.
